Subject: **Central Pool MBBS & BDS seats – allocation for the year 2015-16
– reg.**

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Sir,

I am directed to say that **four** MBBS seats have been allocated to your State for the academic session 2015-16 from the Central Pool out of which one seat is in NSCB Nalanda Medical College, Patna, Bihar; one seat in Medical College, Alappuzha, Kerala; one seat is in Govt. Medical College, Miraj, Maharashtra and remaining one seat is in SMS Medical College, Jaipur, Rajasthan.

2. These MBBS seats are being allocated for allotment to the candidates from the State of Jammu & Kashmir belonging to either of the three following categories: -

- i) Children of families where a parent or a direct member of the family has been killed in acts of terrorism or has been an innocent victim in cross-firing or in firing by armed forces in combating terrorism;
- ii) Children of such persons who are exposed to substantive risk due to their assignment mainly relating to combating acts of terrorism; added weightage is to be given to persons who have come in the 'hit list' of terrorist organizations; and
- iii) Children of such families of both Muslims and non-Muslims who have migrated from Kashmir due to the current situation and have lost their means of livelihood including their business or use of their property.

3. Further, the following points may also kindly be kept in view in this behalf:

- a) It may please be ensured that the candidates selected should fall within one of the above three categories. The children of All India Service Officers posted in the State would also be eligible to participate in the said merit system. Selection of candidates in Category (iii) above

should be entirely on merit among the eligible candidates in this category.

- b) The selection of eligible candidates will be made as per clarification conveyed vide this Ministry's letter of even number dated 12th May, 2015 (copy enclosed). The copy of the merit list together with copies of allotment letters may be sent to this Ministry.
- c) The admission of candidates to the above said Medical Colleges will depend on their fulfilling the eligibility criteria, which may be ascertained from the respective Colleges immediately.

4. The selected candidates may be advised to report to the above Medical Colleges for admission well in time.

5. It should be ensured that every selected candidate carries duly attested documents including his/her photograph, when reporting for admission.

6. An intimation may be sent to the undersigned within 7 days of the actual admission of the selected candidates, alongwith full particulars and the category to which he/she belongs.

7. If any of the allocated seats is not utilized, this Ministry should be informed immediately. In case, any seat remains unutilized and this Ministry is not informed forthwith, this Ministry may have no choice but to curtail the allotment of seats in the succeeding years.

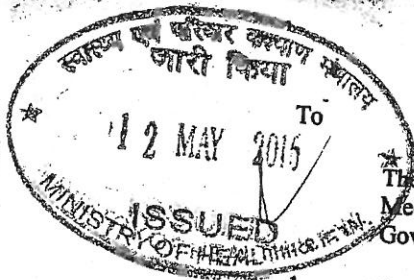

Subject: Guidelines for Allocation of Central Pool MBBS/BDS seats for the academic year 2015-16 – reg.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to the subject mentioned above and to say that this Ministry has received the communications from beneficiary States/UTs seeking clarification on the mode of selection of candidates for nomination against Central Pool MBBS/BDS seats.

2. The matter has been considered in this Ministry in light of judgement/directions passed by Apex Court in various cases, it has been decided with the approval of competent authority that for this academic year i.e. 2015-16, the selection of students will be made by the beneficiary States/UTs on the basis of marks obtained by their students in the Entrance Tests conducted by the beneficiary State/UT. If the beneficiary State/UT is not conducting any entrance examination, the selection will be made on the basis of marks obtained by the students in All India Pre-Medical Entrance Test (AIPMT) conducted by CBSE. As per clause 5 of Graduate Medical Education Regulations 1997 of Medical Council of India, the minimum qualifying marks in the entrance examination are 50% for General, 40% for SC/ST/OBC and 45% for PH Gen-PH and 40% for SC-PH/ST-PH/OBC-PH category candidates. As per clause 4(2) of Graduate Medical Education Regulation 1997 of Medical Council of India, for becoming eligible for entrance examination, candidate must have passed in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-Technology and English individually and must have obtained a minimum of 50% marks (40% for SC/ST/OBC and 45% for Gen-PH and 40% for SC-PH/ST-PH/OBC-PH category candidates) taken together in Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-Technology at the qualifying examination as mentioned in clause 4(2) of Regulations on Graduate Medical Education 1997. In any circumstances, the selection of students will not be made merely on academic merit of 10+2 marks.

Dear Sir,

As you are aware, we have been allocating MBBS/BDS seats to your State/Union Territory for the selection and nomination of eligible candidates, some instances have, however come to our notice where some of the allottee agencies have not followed the relevant instructions issued by the Government of India while selecting and nominating candidates against the seats allotted by us.

2. It is once again reiterated that only the children of (i) permanent residents of the State/UT concerned; (ii) the employees of the State/UT Government concerned; (iii) the employees of the Central/other State/UT Government on deputation to the State/UT concerned and (iv) the employees of the Central/other State/UT Govt. posted in and having their headquarters within the State/UT concerned will be eligible.

3. The children of Central/State/UT Government employees aforementioned should be treated at par with the local resident. The sole criteria for selection will be the academic merit of the candidates, subject to any special orders issued with the concurrence of the Government of India.

4. 22½ % of the seats allotted to each State/UT concerned will be reserved for students belonging to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes of that State/UT. The break-up of this reservation will be as follows:-

- (a) A distinct reservation of 15% for Scheduled Castes and 7½% for Scheduled Tribes.
- (b) The reservation as mentioned in sub-para (a) above, can be interchanged. Thus, if a sufficient number of candidates are not available to fill-up seats reserved for Scheduled Tribes, they may be filled-up by suitable candidates from Scheduled Castes and vice-versa; and
- (c) If the number of available scheduled caste and Scheduled Tribe qualified candidates is less than 22 ½% of the seats; the balance can be given to non-scheduled caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates.

5. Only those candidates will be eligible for admission against the seats reserved for the Government of India who have secured atleast 50% (40% in the case of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes or as amended by the Medical Council of India from time-to-time of the aggregate marks in English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology in the qualifying examination, pre-medical/1st year of three years degree course/1st year of three year B.Sc (Hons) course-pre-degree (two years course/pre-university (two years course) – 10+2 under the new pattern of 10+2+3 or any other examination recognized as equivalent by the Medical Council of India. 80% weightage is to be given to the results of the eligible examinations for admission and 20% to that of matriculation or school leaving examination; when a candidate has passed B.Sc or M.Sc examinations, then 80% weightage is to be given to the result of the eligible examination, 10% to the results of the matriculation or school leaving and 10% on the results of the B.Sc or M.Sc. examinations.

It may further be noted that –

- (a) For a candidate who has passed the qualifying examination in the 2nd attempt, 2% of the marks from the total aggregate should deducted in determining his merit; and
- (b) Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination in more than two attempts should not normally be considered suitable for medical studies.

7. It is requested that the above criteria for the selection and nomination of candidates against the MBBS/BDS seats reserved for the Central Government should strictly followed. The Central Section Committee in this Ministry will also follow the procedure.
