

Case definition for Zika Virus Disease

Suspected case

Patient with skin rash or elevation of body temperature more than or equal to 37.2 degrees Celsius with one or more of the following symptoms (not explained by other medical conditions):

- Arthralgia or myalgia
- Non-purulent conjunctivitis or conjunctival hyperaemia
- Headache or malaise

With history of travel to countries with indigenous transmission of Zika Virus Disease* in last 2 weeks

Confirmed case

A suspected case with laboratory positive result for the specific detection of Zika Virus by RT-PCR

* Countries & Territories with Active Zika Virus Transmission from 2015 onwards
