Subject: Increase of intake capacity from 100 to 150 seats in MBBS course at **KMCT Medical College, Kerala** for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10A of IMC Act, 19546 & stoppage of de-recognition of recognized MBBS Seats -Reg

Sir/Madam,

In supersession to this Ministry's letter dated 15.06.2016 and with reference to your fresh compliance/representation submitted in light of directive dated 13.06.2016 of the Supreme Court mandated Oversight Committee (OC), I am directed to say that the OC has approved the application for increase of seats in the MBBS course from 100 to 150 for the academic year 2016-17 u/s 10A of IMC Act, 1956 and stoppage of de-recognition of 100 MBBS Seats at KMCT Medical College, Kerala subject to submission of the following:

- i. An affidavit from the Dean/Principal and Chairman of the Trust concerned, affirming fulfilment of all deficiencies and statements made in the respective compliance report submitted to MHFW (by 27.09.2016).
 - ii. A bank guarantee in the amount of Rs. 2 crore in favour of MCI, which will be valid for 1 year or until the first renewal assessment, whichever is later. Such bank guarantee will be in addition to the prescribed fee submitted alongwith the application (27.09.2016).
2. The OC has also stipulated as follows:-
- (a) OC may direct inspection to verify the compliance submitted by the college and considered by OC, any time after 30 September 2016.
 - (b) In default of the conditions (i) and (ii) in para 1 above and if the compliances are found incomplete in the inspection to be conducted after 30 September 2016, such college will be debarred from fresh intake of students for 2 years commencing 2017-18.
3. The College is further directed to:
- (i) Upload on the its website the status of compliance with MSRs in respect of faculty, infrastructure, clinical material, bed occupancy and other requirement as on 10th September, 2016 in the first instance followed by another update on the website/s as on 20th September, 2016 and the status may be intimated to OC immediately by 27.09.2016.
 - (ii) Maintain and display the following details of its website for at least 3 months, in order to ensure transparency in admission to UG/PG (Super Speciality) courses for the academic year 2016-17:
 - i. Name of candidate
 - ii. Roll Number
 - iii. NEET Ranking
 - iv. State Ranking and
 - v. Amount of fee paid for admission to the course




A copy of the details so uploaded in each case by the institute on its respective website may be furnished by the institute to the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare and Medical Council of India. The Notification/Approval is subject to complying with the above directives of OC.

Failure to comply with this direction will automatically lead to holding conditional approval granted to your college for 2016-17, in abeyance.

4. Accordingly the College is permitted to admit students in MBBS course against recognized intake of 100 seats for the academic session 2016-17. A letter of permission for increase of intake capacity from 100 to 150 seats in MBBS course for the academic year 2016-17 at **KMCT Medical College, Kerala** u/s 10A of IMC Act, 1956 is hereby issued subject to furnishing documents/ bank guarantee as per para 1 above alongwith another Bank Guarantee of required amount in favour of Medical Council of India, New Delhi valid for five years from a nationalized/scheduled Bank as per MCI Regulations 1999 for increase of intake capacity from 100 to 150 seats in MBBS course by 27.09.2016 to this Ministry. In the event of non-submission of the affidavit and Bank Guarantees within the stipulated period, the letter of permission for increase in intake capacity and stoppage of de-recognition shall stand withdrawn.
5. The permission of the Central Government is accorded initially for a period of one year and will be renewed on yearly basis subject to verification of the achievement of annual targets as indicated in your scheme and revalidation of performance Bank Guarantee. This process of renewal of permission will continue till such time the infrastructure & expansion of hospital facility are completed and a formal recognition of the Medical College against increased intake is granted.
6. The next Batch of students against increased intake in MBBS course will be admitted in the college only after permission of Central Government for renewal/recognition and fulfilling the condition of OC stipulated in para 2 of this letter.
7. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as irregular and action under IMC Act, 1956 & Regulations made thereunder will be initiated.
8. Discrepancies, if any, may be brought to the notice of MCI and Central/State Government.
9. Kindly acknowledge receipt of this letter.
