#### OFFICE ORDER

The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India has put in place the requirement of Polio Vaccination (OPV/IPV) for all travelers travelling to India, as well as going to countries which are endemic for Poliovirus infection or listed as countries with Poliovirus circulation.

- 2 As per WHO, the latest Poliovirus infected countries\* are:
  - a. Polio endemic countries: Afghanistan, Pakistan.
  - b. Countries with poliovirus circulation/ or having circulating VDPVs: Cameroon, Nigeria, Malawi, Mozambique, Madagascar, Congo, DR Congo, Somalia and Syria.

\*The list of polio infected countries may be amended from time to time by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, depending on poliovirus detection.

- 3 These mandatory requirements are binge effective for travel since 1st May 2024, however, it has been revised in view of non-availability of OPV vaccine in few countries listed above, where IPV is being given.
- 4 Travellers to obtain OPV/IPV Vaccination Certificate mandatorily from designated Health Officer of their respective countries.

Revised Advisory for Requirement of Polio Vaccination for International Travellers between India and polio infected countries

#### Glossary of Terms used in text

DIO District Immunization Officer

- A) The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India has outlined the requirement of Oral/Inactivated Polio Vaccine (OPV/IPV) for all inbound travellers travelling to India as well as outbound travellers to countries which are endemic for poliovirus infection or listed as countries with polio virus circulation.
  - 1) As per WHO, the latest Poliovirus infected countries\* are:
    - a) Polio endemic countries: Afghanistan, Pakistan
    - b) Countries till recently endemic and/ or having circulating VDPVs: Nigeria, Somalia, Syria, Cameroon, Malawi, Mozambique, Madagascar, Congo and DR Congo

(\*List of polio infected countries may be amended from time to time by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, depending on poliovirus detection)

- 2) Travellers to India should possess *Vaccination certificate for Polio vaccine*, issued by Authorized Health Officers of their respective countries.
- 3) Vaccination Certificate shall be issued after taking an additional dose of *OPV/IPV at least four weeks prior* to travel to India.
- 4) This vaccination Certificate issued after this additional dose shall be considered *valid for a period of one year*.
- B) Vaccination requirements for inbound travellers to India from countries with ongoing poliovirus transmission
  - 1) Resident national/ National: Anyone who carries the passport of notified 11 countries should be vaccinated with polio vaccine (OPV/IPV) as per the advisory, irrespective of whether he/she, -
    - 1.1) Directly comes from the notified country or;
    - 1.2) Comes via other country or;

- 1.3) Has history of visits in last 1 year to their native country if residing outside their country.
- 2) Resident nationals/ residents of the above said eleven polio-infected countries must, -
  - 2.1 Receive an Oral /In-activated polio vaccine (OPV/IPV) dose at least four weeks prior to travel to India, regardless of age or vaccination status;
  - 2.2 Present an OPV/IPV vaccination certificate (*copy of certificate uploaded*) when applying for an Indian visa.
- 3) For *Pregnant woman*, OPV is safe. However Pregnant travellers may take polio vaccine in any form i.e. OPV/IPV (As per WHO position paper on polio vaccine).
- 4) Immunocompromised person travelling to India should vaccinate with IPV only.
- 5) Travellers to India should contact the local health authorities in their respective countries for getting vaccination with OPV/IPV and the certificate for the same. This requirement also applies to Indian nationals and NRIs from these countries.
- 6) It is not mandatory for foreign nationals residing in these eleven polio infected countries, to receive vaccination with OPV/IPV before travel to India. However, they are advised to receive a dose of OPV/IPV four weeks prior to travel in their own interest.
- 7) The travellers from these eleven countries, who lack vaccination certificate, shall mandatorily receive OPV at the arrival Point of Entry (Airport/Port/Land border), failing which regulatory action shall be taken by Government of India.
- 8) Diplomatic and official/service passport holders from eleven polio-infected countries, including Indian diplomats, are *not exempted* from the requirement of polio vaccination certificate.
- 9) All travellers, regardless of passport type, must comply with the polio vaccination requirements to safeguard public health.
- C) Vaccination requirement for outbound travellers from India to countries with ongoing poliovirus transmission
  - Indian residents, NRIs travelling from India to these eleven polio infected countries
    are required to receive a dose of OPV/IPV at least four weeks prior to departure,
    regardless of age and vaccination status.

- Each district in India has designated at least one centre where vaccination with OPV/IPV will be provided to travellers and OPV/IPV vaccination certificate will be issued. In this regard;
  - 2.1 The District Immunization Officer (DIO) is the designated official for issuance of OPV/IPV vaccination certificate to travellers;
  - 2.2 All Yellow Fever Vaccination Centres (YFVC) authorised under Directorate General of Health Services, MOHFW are also designated centres for OPV/IPV and issue the OPV/IPV vaccination certificate.
- 3) It is not mandatory for foreign nationals residing in India to receive vaccination with OPV/IPV before travelling to the eleven polio infected countries. However, they are advised to receive a dose of OPV/IPV four weeks prior to travel in their own interest.

#### D) Provision of vaccines/ vaccination at the PoEs

- 1) Travellers arriving from or departing to above mentioned eleven countries, who have not received OPV/IPV vaccination four weeks prior to the date of travel, when referred by Immigration Officers, shall be vaccinated at the Point of entry by the Health Officials at APHOs/PHOs/LPHOs and shall be issued a vaccination certificate to proceed on further travel.
- 2) The DIO will supply the OPV/IPV on demand, free of cost to the Point of Entries and Authorised Yellow Fever Vaccination Centres.
- 3) All Authorised Yellow Fever Vaccination Centres (YFVC) are also designated centres for OPV/IPV vaccination to International Travellers to these eleven Polio endemic countries. (<a href="https://www.ihpoe.mohfw.gov.in">www.ihpoe.mohfw.gov.in</a> provides the list of the YFVC in India)
- 4) The OPV/IPV vaccination and certification are given free of cost to International Travellers to these eleven Polio endemic countries.
- 5) OPV/IPV wherever mentioned denotes route of administration of vaccination.
